BUSINESS MANAGER REPORT

Brothers and Sisters of IBEW L.U. 405,

At our November Pension Trust meeting, we lowered the retirement age to take pension distributions without penalty. We lowered the age from 62 to 59 1/2. This will go into effect January 1st, 2026. This will give our retirement age members more flexibility earlier. Our financial advisers recommend that because of our low fees and competitive returns on investment, it is better to keep the pension funds with Milliman versus pulling your entire pension and going with another broker. Last month we urged everyone to get out and vote on November 4th. This off-cycle election was primarily school boards and city councils. Seventeen of the twenty-five Hawkeye Area Labor Council (HALC) endorsed candidates won their races. Thank you to everyone who got out and voted and/or door knocked for a candidate, you helped make those candidates successful and our endorsement mean something. On a more negative note, the Cedar Rapids School Bond vote failed to pass. We were extremely close but only received 59.3% of the required 60% for a bond referendum or 165 votes short. The Cedar Rapids School District will still need to address its ageing buildings, so I would anticipate another vote in the future.

The IBEW State Conference has officially endorsed Rob Sand for Governor. Rob Sand is our current State Auditor and the only statewide elected Democrat. Rob has served as a trusted leader and government watchdog with a record of rooting out waste, fraud, and abuse, holding members of both parties accountable, and doing what's right for Iowans.

The IBEW State Conference has also endorsed Nate Willems for Attorney General. Nate Willems is currently a Labor Lawyer in Cedar Rapids. In representing tens of thousands of Iowa workers, he hasn't been afraid to take on corporations who have stolen wages, ignored workers' rights, or injured workers on the job.

We need to do everything we can in this next election to get these two men elected. We have not had a better opportunity in recent history to make real change in the capital. If we can shake things up in the Iowa Capital, we can make some positive changes for working class people and start to turn this state around.
